



## **2019 Garand Match**

The annual M1 Garand Match has crowned the TRPC Rifle Champion the last couple of decades. The match consists of 50 time-limited shots for record. There are four separate 200 yard events including slow-fire & rapid-fire from prone, sitting and offhand positions. A GI ling, web or leather, is the only support allowed except for offhand. This type of contest has been used in inter-service rivalries for over 100 years.

The Garand is a 70 year old, 10 lb, walnut and steel infantry firearm. When fired, big steel parts zing back and forth, sending hot, heavy, brass in all directions. A .30 Cal. Muzzle blast, stout recoil, and the ka-ching of ejecting clips add to the charm of a Garand Match. The old rifles are reliable, but not intrinsically accurate. Powder charge, bullet weight, fit of the parts and proper bedding are critical to accuracy. Even so, flyers and group shifts are normal, but with proper skill, one can extract decent accuracy from the M1.

Several Garand cognoscenti took part in the annual match. Best of the best was Ray Brandes of Panama City Beach who beat nine other competitors for his 2<sup>nd</sup> straight top honor. On top of his marksmanship skills, Ray let slip the recent cataract surgeries gave him, in effect, bionic vision. Ray will be tough to beat in the coming years. So if you have that old M1 in the safe or are in need of one through the CMP rifle program, start practicing now and maybe this time next year, the John C. Garand Cup may be yours.
