### TRPC Sporting Clays Fall Fun Shoot

TRPC hosted a Sporting Clays event on Saturday, December 4nd<sup>-</sup> Although the day started with a dense fog, the start was only delayed for about an hour. The day was a beautiful one for shotgunning, with nice temperatures and some clouds. We had great attendance with 30 participants shooting. This event raised over \$700 for our junior programs.

Sporting Clays has become very popular with our members and guests as well. We officially entered our eighth season with the 2021 Fall Shoot. This event is held three times per year and in the cooler months. The availability of ammunition is taking its toll on participation in all the matches. Hopefully the supply chain will improve and attendance will improve as availability increases.

The course consisted of 10 stations, or shooting locations. Five targets were thrown from each in the following order: a single target, a report pair of targets where a single target is thrown and a second follows upon the report of the gun, and finally a true pair, or two targets thrown simultaneously. Targets varied in size, speed and direction. Shooters are given some challenging presentations by using remote target throwers. These can be placed several hundred feet from the shooter and brings additional challenges and fun to the event.

Our club has invested in some nice equipment and it is getting utilized. Most recently, the club purchased a fourth remote thrower that helps make the course even more enjoyable. All of the Club equipment is functioning well. Throwing arms are mounted on a trailer that may be located on Ranges E and F. The Club also has a number of portable shooting stations, gun rack and various items needed for a great event.

Lunch was included in the entry fee and consisted of delicious pork ribs, bbq chicken, potato salad, mac and chees, baked beans, chips and drinks. Many thanks to Angie Gebhart and John Schmidt for delicious food; and a huge shoutout to Jim Hines for doing the BBQ. Jim's ribs are simply outstanding and were a real hit.

# **BRASS MAN**

In the third quarter 2021 newsletter, a request was made for club members to donate their unwanted brass to the club. Recently, an anonymous club member answered that request in a big way. That member donated approximately 75 to 80 pounds of non-reloadable (Berdan) rifle brass and other brass that could no longer be reloaded due to case damage. That generous donation contributed to the club being able to receive nearly \$140 from the sale of the brass in October. If you would like to donate your unwanted brass to the club it is easy. There is a large yellow bucket located in the clubhouse where you can dump your brass. Alternately, you can just leave behind whatever kind of container you used to collect the brass in the first place. Gallon milk jugs seems to be the current favorite. As before, if you do reload, then keep on reloading with the brass you have. No one wants you to give up your brass. However, once that brass is no longer wanted or reloadable, please consider donating what you have to the club. It will be greatly appreciated. Recycled brass has resulted in over \$900 in revenue to the club in the last four years.

How old is your ammo? Recently, two .30-06 cartridge cases were found while recycling brass for the club. These cases were manufactured by Remington Arms in 1918. They apparently never made it to France to be used against the Hun. The case necks were cracked and the bullets were gone, but the cases were un-fired. Inside, the powder or what was the powder, was a sticky black tar. After scraping out the black tar, the rounds were loaded in a .30-06 rifle and the trigger pulled. Guess what happened? Nothing. The primers were dead. This is not a cautionary tale, only one of interest. The truly interesting part is the headstamps. One case was marked "RA 18" and the other was marked "RA H 18." The first was case was manufactured by Remington Arms' facility in Bridgeport, Connecticut. The second was manufactured by the company's facility in Hoboken, New Jersey. You never know what you might find.
