Destin Guest appointed to United States Military Academy at West Point

Destin Guest began participating in the TRPC Youth Program when he was a student at Deerlake Middle School in 2018. Destin has always had a passion for firearms and marksmanship, and he even completed his 7th grade science fair project on the subject of ballistics with the help of TRPC volunteer, Jim Fowler.

Destin has also had a long-time desire to serve in the military with inspiration from many TRPC volunteers, as well as from his father who served as a tanker in the Marines in the Gulf War. His wise father advised Destin to join a college ROTC program or attend a service academy rather than enlisting after high school. Destin decided to set his goal high and try to earn an appointment to a service academy.

Destin learned that service academies look for high achievement in academics, leadership, and athletics. His counselors at Lawton Chiles High School navigated him to take challenging Advanced Placement courses and guided him to leadership positions such as becoming the President of the Chiles Ambassadors. However, his path to high achievement in athletics did not go as planned.

Destin had competed in team sports including tackle football since he was 6 years old. He was the starting Center for the Deerlake Bucks when they won the District Championship in 2021. He also trained in various forms of martial arts and began wrestling in 8th grade with early success earning a medal as Youth State Runner-Up in his weight class. He earned a Varsity Letter in wrestling his freshman year at Lawton Chiles High School. Then, halfway through his sophomore year, Destin tore the ACL in his right knee while wrestling.

Destin's injury required surgery, and his orthopedic advised him to not return to wrestling if he still wanted to serve in the military. It was very difficult for Destin to leave the sport of wrestling behind, but he realized that he needed to rehabilitate his knee and stay healthy to be able to serve in the military. After reviewing the athletic teams at the service academies and realizing that Rifle is an NCAA team sport, Destin decided that he wanted to become a precision rifle athlete.

In January 2023, Destin came back to the TRPC Youth Program to find some guidance. Luckily, he found John Schmidt who had prior experience with training his own son in precision rifle. John spent countless hours at the range with Destin and journeyed to the Ole Mill Range Complex in Griffin, GA with the whole Guest family to watch Destin compete in his first air rifle competition using John's son's air rifle.

That summer, Destin's parents helped him acquire his own air rifle, a custom fit Capapie shooting suit, and all the necessary equipment to attend a Civilian Marksmanship Program camp for precision air rifle taught by NCAA college athletes at the CMP South range in Anniston, AL. At the camp, Destin met the Leon High School JROTC rifle team led by Sergeant Major Russell Brown who invited Destin to practice with them on their electronic targets at their home range in Tallahassee throughout the school year.

To further his training, Destin joined Team Winning Solutions (TWS) which is a national organization led by members of the USA Shooting National Team. He received regular virtual training from his main coach, Jeanne Haverhill, who was a previous member of the Akron Rifle program and then used her fifth year of eligibility as a member of the TCU Rifle Team that won the 2024 NCAA Rifle National Championship. Jeanne pushed Destin to succeed and encouraged him to compete in all three of the U.S. Olympic Trials. Destin had just received his new Walther KK500 smallbore rifle days before the first Trials at the Army Marksmanship Unit range in Ft. Benning, GA, but he successfully completed the competition and met the assistant coach from West Point who started recruiting Destin for their rifle team.

Over the course of the next year, Destin continued competing in both air rifle and smallbore around the country at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO, at the Shooting Sports Education Center at Georgia Southern University, at West Virginia University, at the University of Kentucky, and at CMP Camp Perry in Ohio. He even traveled overseas with TWS to train and compete in the International Grand Prix of Leppa in Finland.

In June 2024, Destin attended Summer Leader Experience at the United States Military Academy at West Point followed by another week of Elite Rifle Camp at the Tronsrue Marksmanship Center, which solidified his desire to become a cadet at West Point. On his birthday, September 13th, Destin was invited for an unofficial overnight visit at West Point followed by the Black Knight Open rifle competition that weekend. He left West Point knowing that he was now a recruited athlete. On February 28th, Destin committed to the West Point Rifle Team and accepted his offer of appointment to the USMA Class of 2029.

Destin's main rifle goal for his senior year of high school was to qualify for National Junior Olympics, which he had missed out on the year before. The Florida Rifle Junior Olympics was held at the Firearms Training Club of America in Lakeland, FL in January and February. In March, Destin was notified by USA Shooting that as the U21 Florida State Champion in both air rifle and 3-position smallbore, he earned an automatic invitation to the National Junior Olympics that will be held at CMP in Anniston, AL in mid-April.

Destin will be part of the Rifle Team at West Point. Congratulations!

The next year, their son John was born. And the year after that, their daughter Jill completed their family. The Schmidt family moved to Melbourne, FL where after 23 years, John retired from the Air Force. He made printers and card punches before landing a job with Honeywell working on the space shuttle's computer system. His final job before retirement was working on a drone program at Harris Corporation for Lockheed Martin. "That was a fun job!" John exclaimed.

John would've happily continued working on the interface and testing of drones when his daughter called with the news that she was pregnant with their first grandchild. John and Phyllis decided to move to Tallahassee to help raise their granddaughter, Lindsay.

John and Phyllis loved helping raise Lindsay. They took her on an annual vacation to Shades of Green in Orlando. John taught her how to drive a car – he taught many of her friends how to drive. When Phyllis became ill, Lindsay moved her wedding date up by a year just so her grandmother



could attend.

In 2022, Phyllis passed away. John had been her loving caregiver. With Lindsay grown and living in Orlando, John needed social interaction. His daughter Jill encouraged him to visit the Tallahassee Senior Center. John stopped by a few times but at the encouragement of his daughter, on the third visit he took a tour. John attended the Friends Connection group and found his home. "I can't live without friends," he explains.

John soon became an indispensable part of Friends Connection. Then he started taking fitness classes like Brain, Body, Balance and Mindful Movement. John thought, "What can I do?" and soon he found himself serving on the TSC Advisory Council, the membership committee, and most recently he is the volunteer check-in at Brain Body Balance. He takes his role seriously by attending the monthly Coalition on Aging meetings that typically just staff attends – "you learn so much!" he says.

Then John started volunteering at the monthly TSC Coffee Chat meetings that introduce new participants to the various programs offered at the Senior Center. John, ever the ambassador, takes new participants on tours and has been known to share his personal cellphone number with those participants who seem shy, hesitant, or overwhelmed. He relates to that feeling because he felt the same way when he first visited. He enjoys making others feel welcome and at ease.



For the past several years, John has been volunteering at the Tallahassee Rifle & Pistol Club every weekend teaching kids how to use guns safely. His son went to college on a shooting scholarship and his granddaughter enjoyed "shooting trap" with family. One of the young men John mentors just won the Florida Air Rifle championship and the Smallbore Rifle championship.

John enjoys mentoring kids. His advice to people young is "Your word is your promise. Stay honest and true it." John practices what he preaches.

OLD Business

\$\$\$ - motion to allocate up to \$6000.00 for club purchase of electronic targeting system for High Power Match. This motion was brought before the membership at the October meeting but was tabled due to lack of quorum. Jim Fowler presented the targeting system to the members. After discussion, the motion was approved. The system will be purchased through Jim Fowler and should be ready for delivery in the summer.

\$\$\$ - The continued development of Range H project was discussed. The project entails improvements and expansion of the firing line to the north side of Range B. The motion to appropriate \$30,000.00 to reprofile Range H and square it up to provide for a more logical and true 50 yard pistol/rimfire range; to clear and reprofile approximately 1 acre and construct side safety berms for an additional 25 yard pistol/rimfire range; to clear and reprofile approximately 1 additional acre for travel, parking and use as borrow area for necessary soil for the improvements. After discussion, the motion to allocate \$30,000 was approved by the membership.

- ➤ Vice President TRPC will be trying to schedule another controlled burn of the property in 2025. Cost will be around \$5000.00
- ➤ Treasure's Report TRPC is in good financial standing. All bills are paid and accounts reconciled. Motion to approve financial report approved by membership.
- ➤ Secretary's Report TRPC Membership stands at 430 members. Renewal forms will be mailed out in May. Please return promptly or notify <u>secretary@trpc.net</u> if you will not be renewing. It helps me out immensely.
- Youth Program the number of advanced shooters continues to grow. One of our long time youth shooters has an appointment to West Point Rifle Team. MARCH 29, 2025 WORKDAY PLAN

A regular 5th Saturday work day will be held MARCH 29th. Let's get some Spring Cleaning accomplished and get our property looking good for the Summer.

Bring your yard care tools (edgers, blowers, string trimmers, etc.) Also remember that proper gear including gloves and good eye protection is just as important when working with power tools and clearing brush. Prepare accordingly.

Ranges A2 and B - new target backers and any needed repairs to target frames. Remove brush and dead wood A1 and B as marked.

Range F – trim overhangs and downed/dead trees.

Range G – prepare pad area for new conex. Clear all trees and brush as marked.

Painting - convenience tables on Range D and the pavilion/shelter. Paint and tools will be provided, included clean-up supplies.

Pick up brush, limbs etc. across the range and pile up in waste areas. A prescribed burn is happening and will take care of piles.

Empty trash cans.

Clear roofs and surroundings of all structures of brush and straw in preparation on burning.

Clean up around BOD and Youth Conex. VP will give more info.

Needed: powered limb saw, string trimmers, chain saws, blower.

Crew 1 – target backers and stands. Empty trash cans.

Crew 2 – painting D range and pavilion.

Crew 3 – Clear structures, trimming/edging and blowing

Crew 4 – Sawing trimming piling.

Bring appropriate work clothes, eye and ear protection, gloves.
